The annual movement of wildebeest and other herbivores across the Serengeti-Mara ecosystem consists of more than 1.5 million wildebeest, 200 000 zebra, 18 000 eland and 500 000 Thompson's gazelle. The Migration is rarely the same in terms of precise timing and direction.

JANUARY – MARCH

The animals gather on the southern Serengeti plains, dropping their calves. The plains are a short drive from &Beyond Ngorongoro Crater Lodge and &Beyond Serengeti Under Canvas.

APRIL – MAY

The herds move north, towards the central Serengeti plains and the Seronera area. The &Beyond Serengeti Under Canvas camps follow.

JUNE

The herds move northwest, towards &Beyond Grumeti Serengeti Tented Camp. The luxury tented camps of &Beyond Serengeti Under Canvas reposition themselves.

JULY – OCTOBER

The herds start heading northeast, followed by the &Beyond Serengeti Under Canvas camps. The wildebeest must cross the Mara River before they reach Kenya's Masai Mara, to the west of &Beyond Klein's Camp. As the animals continue to move backwards and forwards across the river, the excitement can also be viewed from &Beyond Kichwa Tembo Tented Camp and &Beyond Bateleur Camp.

NOVEMBER – DECEMBER

Crossing back into the Serengeti, the Migration moves south, passing &Beyond's Klein's Camp and Serengeti Under Canvas.
